A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE NORTH CAROLINA CENTER FOR MISSING
3 PERSONS TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND PRIVATE DONATIONS FOR THE
4 NORTH CAROLINA CHILD ALERT NOTIFICATION SYSTEM – NC CAN
5 (AMBER ALERT), TO ESTABLISH CRITERIA TO TRIGGER AN "AMBER
6 ALERT", TO COORDINATE THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS, AND TO
7 PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
8 CHANGEABLE MESSAGE SIGNS TO DISPLAY INFORMATION
9 REGARDING MISSING CHILDREN.

10 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

11 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 143B-499.1 reads as rewritten:

12 **"§ 143B-499.1. Dissemination of missing persons data by law-enforcement**
13 **agencies.**

14 A law-enforcement agency, upon receipt of a missing person report by a parent,
15 spouse, guardian, or legal custodian, shall immediately make arrangements for the entry
16 of data about the missing person or missing child into the national missing persons file
17 in accordance with criteria set forth by the FBI/NCIC, immediately inform all of its on-
18 duty law-enforcement officers of the missing person report, initiate a statewide
19 broadcast to all appropriate law-enforcement agencies to be on the lookout for the
20 individual, and transmit a copy of the report to the Center.

21 If the report involves a missing child and the report meets the criteria established in
22 G.S. 143B-499.7(b), as soon as practicable after receipt of the report, the

1 law enforcement agency shall notify the Center of the relevant data about the missing
2 child."

3 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 143B-499.2 is amended by adding a new subdivision to
4 read:

5 "(6a) Develop and maintain the North Carolina Child Alert Notification
6 System (NC CAN) as created by G.S. 143B-499.7;".

7 **SECTION 3.** Article 11 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended
8 by adding a new section to read:

9 **"§ 143B-499.7. North Carolina Child Alert Notification System established.**

10 (a) There is established within the North Carolina Center for Missing Persons the
11 North Carolina Child Alert Notification System (NC CAN). The purpose of NC CAN is
12 to provide a statewide system for the rapid dissemination of information regarding
13 abducted children.

14 (b) The NC CAN System shall make every effort to disseminate information on
15 missing children as quickly as possible when the following criteria are met:

16 (1) The child is 12 years of age or younger;

17 (2) The child is believed to be in danger of injury or death;

18 (3) The abduction is not known or suspected to be by a parent of the child;

19 (4) The child is not a runaway or voluntarily missing; and

20 (5) The abduction has been reported to and investigated by a law
21 enforcement agency.

22 The NC CAN system may disseminate information on missing children who are
23 ages 13 to 17 on a case by case basis, if all other criteria in subdivisions (2) through (5)
24 of this subsection have been met, if the Center believes the dissemination of the
25 information to be beneficial in the possible recovery of the missing child.

26 If the abduction of the child is known or suspected to be by a parent of the child, the
27 Center, in its discretion, may disseminate information through the NC CAN System if
28 the child is believed to be in danger of injury or death.

29 (c) The Center shall adopt guidelines and develop procedures for the statewide
30 implementation of the NC CAN System and shall provide education and training to
31 encourage radio and television broadcasters to participate in the system. The Center
32 shall work with the Department of Justice in developing training material regarding the
33 NC CAN System for law enforcement, broadcasters, and community interest groups.

34 (d) The Center shall consult with the Department of Transportation and develop a
35 procedure for the use of overhead permanent changeable message signs to provide
36 information on the abduction of a child meeting the criteria established in subsection (b)
37 of this section, when information is available that would enable motorists to assist law
38 enforcement in the recovery of the missing child. The Center and the Department of
39 Transportation shall develop guidelines for the content, length, and frequency of any
40 message to be placed on an overhead permanent changeable message sign.

41 (e) The Center shall consult with the Division of Emergency Management, in the
42 Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, to develop a procedure for the use of
43 the Emergency Alert System to provide information on the abduction of a child meeting
44 the criteria established in subsection (b) of this section.

1 (f) The Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, on behalf of the Center,
2 may accept grants, contributions, devises, bequests, and gifts, which shall be kept in a
3 separate fund and shall be used to fund the operations of the Center and the NC CAN
4 System."

5 **SECTION 4.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2002. The
6 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
