6	SECTION 1. G.S. 143B-405 reads as rewritten:

9	The purposes of the Commission shall be as follows:			
10		<u>(1)</u>	to To deal fairly and effectively with Indian affairs; affairs.	
11		<u>(2)</u>	to-To bring local, State, and federal resources into focus for the	
12			implementation or continuation of meaningful programs for Indian	
13			citizens of the State of North Carolina; Carolina.	
14		<u>(3)</u>	to To provide aid and protection for Indians as needs are demonstrated;	
15			to prevent undue hardships; <u>hardships.</u>	
16		<u>(4)</u>	To hold land in trust for the benefit of State-recognized Indian tribes.	
17			This subdivision shall not apply to federally recognized Indian tribes.	
18		<u>(5)</u>	to-To assist Indian communities in social and economic development;	
19			and -development.	
20		<u>(6)</u>	to To promote recognition of and the right of Indians to pursue cultural	
21			and religious traditions considered by them to be sacred and	
22			meaningful to Native Americans."

2		information on any aspect of Indian affairs; affairs.
3	<u>(2)</u>	to-To investigate relief needs of Indians of North Carolina and to
4		provide technical assistance in the preparation of plans for the
5		alleviation of such needs; needs.
6	<u>(3)</u>	to To confer with appropriate officials of local, State and federal
7		governments and agencies of these governments, and with such
8		congressional committees that may be concerned with Indian affairs to
9		encourage and implement coordination of applicable resources to meet
10		the needs of Indians in North Carolina; Carolina.
11	<u>(4)</u>	to To cooperate with and secure the assistance of the local, State and
12		federal governments or any agencies thereof in formulating any such
13		programs, and to coordinate such programs with any programs
14		regarding Indian affairs adopted or planned by the federal government
15		to the end that the State Commission of Indian Affairs secure the full
16		benefit of such programs; programs.
17	<u>(5)</u>	To act as trustee for any interest in real property that may be
18		transferred to the Commission for the benefit of State-recognized
19		Indian tribes in accordance with a trust agreement approved by the
20		Commission. The Commission shall not hold any interest in real
21		property for the benefit of federally recognized Indian tribes.
22	<u>(6)</u>	to To review all proposed or pending State legislation and amendments
23		to existing State legislation affecting Indians in North
24		Carolina;Carolina.
25	<u>(7)</u>	to To conduct public hearings on matters relating to Indian affairs and
26		to subpoena any information or documents deemed necessary by the
27		Commission; Commission.

29		tribes and communities presently existing in the State of North
