SECTION 1. The Charter of the Town of Cary, being Chapter	r 868 of the
Session Laws of 1971 as amended, is further amended by adding the fol

"Section 4.12. Disclosure of Contributors.	
(a) The Town Council may by ordinance require the disclosure by
