A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO MAKE POSSESSION OR MANUFACTURE OF FRAUDULENT  
FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION AN OFFENSE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a  
new section to read:

**"§ 14-100.1. Possession or manufacture of fraudulent forms of identification.**

(a) If any person shall knowingly and designedly possess a false or fraudulent  
form of identification, that person shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

(b) If any person shall knowingly and designedly manufacture a false or  
fraudulent form of identification, that person shall be guilty of a Class H felony.

(c) For purposes of this section a "form of identification" shall include all of the  
following:

(1) An operator's, chauffeur's, commercial driver's, or similar type of  
drivers license containing a picture, issued by the Division of Motor  
Vehicles or an equivalent agency in any state.

(2) An identification card containing a picture, issued by any department,  
agency, or subdivision of the State of North Carolina.

(3) A military identification card containing a picture.

(4) A passport.

(5) An alien registration card containing a picture.

(6) Any form of identification containing a picture."

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to  
offenses committed on or after that date.
