SENATE BILL 833

Short Title: Possessing Fraudulent ID to Get Liquor.

2 AN ACT TO MAKE IT ILLEGAL TO POSSESS FRAUDULENT IDENTIFICATION
3 WHILE ATTEMPTING TO ENTER A PERMITTEE OR OBTAIN ALCOHOLIC
4 BEVERAGES.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 18B-302 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

7 "(e1) Fraudulent Possession of Identification. – It shall be unlawful for any person
8 to possess or to display fraudulent identification, as defined in subdivisions (e)(1)
9 through (e)(4) of this section, while attempting to obtain alcoholic beverages or while
10 attempting to obtain or obtaining permission to purchase alcoholic beverages from a
11 permittee."

12 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to
13 offenses committed on or after that date.
