A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO INCLUDE THE STATE LODGE OF THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE
IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE EDUCATION AND TRAINING
STANDARDS COMMISSION.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 17C-3(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) There is established the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission, hereinafter called "the Commission." The Commission shall be composed of ~~33~~ 34 members as follows:

- (1) Police Chiefs. – Three police chiefs selected by the North Carolina Association of Chiefs of Police and one police chief appointed by the Governor.
- (2) Police Officers. – Three police officials appointed by the North Carolina Police Executives Association and two criminal justice officers certified by the Commission as selected by the North Carolina Law-Enforcement Officers' Association.
- (3) Departments. – The Attorney General of the State of North Carolina; the Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety; the Secretary of Correction; the President of the North Carolina Community Colleges System; the Secretary of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention.
- (3a) Repealed by Session Laws 2001-440, s. 1.2, effective June 30, 2001.
- (4) At-large Groups. – One individual representing and appointed by each of the following organizations: one mayor selected by the League of Municipalities; one law-enforcement training officer selected by the North Carolina Law-Enforcement Training Officers' Association; one criminal justice professional selected by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Association; one sworn law-enforcement officer selected by the North State Law-Enforcement Officers' Association; one member selected by the State Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police; one member selected by the North Carolina Law-Enforcement Women's Association; and one District Attorney selected by the North Carolina Association of District Attorneys.
- (5) Citizens and Others. – The President of The University of North Carolina; the Dean of the School of Government at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; and two citizens, one of whom shall be selected by the Governor and one of whom shall be selected by the Attorney General. The



1 General Assembly shall appoint four persons, two upon the recommendation
2 of the Speaker of the House of Representatives and two upon the
3 recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. Appointments
4 by the General Assembly shall be made in accordance with G.S. 120-122.
5 Appointments by the General Assembly shall be for two-year terms to
6 conclude on June 30th in odd-numbered years.

7 (6) Correctional Officers. – Four correctional officers in management positions
8 employed by the Department of Correction shall be appointed, two from the
9 Division of Community Corrections upon the recommendation of the
10 Speaker of the House of Representatives and two from the Division of
11 Prisons upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the
12 Senate. Appointments by the General Assembly shall be made in accordance
13 with G.S. 120-122. Appointments by the General Assembly shall serve
14 two-year terms to conclude on June 30th in odd-numbered years. The
15 Governor shall appoint one correctional officer employed by the Department
16 of Correction and assigned to the Office of Staff Development and Training.
17 The Governor's appointment shall serve a three-year term."

18 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
