A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO REALIGN THE DISTRICTS FOR WAKE COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT
JUDGE SEATS TO PROVIDE FOR SINGLE MEMBER DISTRICTS AND EQUAL
REPRESENTATION IN THOSE DISTRICTS, WHICH ARE TO BE DETERMINED.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 7A-41 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-41. Superior court divisions and districts; judges.

(a) **(Effective until January 1, 2009)** The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:
