A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO DIRECT THE NORTH CAROLINA AREA HEALTH EDUCATION
3 CENTERS (AHEC) PROGRAM TO COORDINATE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT
4 EFFORTS TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF DENTAL CARE PROVIDERS SERVING
5 THE SPECIAL NEEDS POPULATION, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE NORTH
6 CAROLINA STUDY COMMISSION ON AGING.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 **SECTION 1.(a)** The North Carolina Area Health Education Centers (AHEC)
9 Program shall coordinate efforts to increase the number of dental care providers serving the
10 special needs population. These efforts shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 11 (1) Working with the dental schools at the University of North Carolina at
12 Chapel Hill and East Carolina University, the North Carolina Community
13 College System, and current dental providers serving the special needs
14 population to identify opportunities to increase the dental care workforce
15 supply that is available and willing to treat the special needs population.
16 These opportunities shall include, but are not limited to, options that could
17 be undertaken without additional funding.
- 18 (2) Working with the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners to
19 explore the feasibility of allowing dental students, dental hygiene students,
20 and assisting students the opportunity to receive training in long-term care
21 facilities under the direction of nonprofit special care dental organizations.

22 **SECTION 1.(b)** The North Carolina Area Health Education Centers (AHEC)
23 Program shall report findings and recommendations to the North Carolina Study Commission
24 on Aging on or before August 1, 2011.

25 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
