A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF LOCUST TO ATTACH PERSONAL  
2 PROPERTY, GARNISH WAGES, AND PLACE LIENS ON CERTAIN REAL  
3 PROPERTY TO COLLECT UNPAID FEES FOR SEWER SERVICES.  
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5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** A city may adopt an ordinance providing that a fee charged by the  
7 city for sewer services and remaining unpaid for a period of 90 days may be collected in any  
8 manner by which delinquent personal or real property taxes can be collected. If the ordinance  
9 states that delinquent fees may be collected in the same manner as delinquent real property  
10 taxes, the delinquent fees are a lien on the real property owned by the person contracting with  
11 the city for the service, and the ordinance shall provide for an appeals process. If a lien is  
12 placed on real property, the lien shall be valid from the time of filing in the office of the clerk  
13 of superior court of the county in which the service was provided and shall include a statement  
14 containing the name and address of the person against whom the lien is claimed, the name of  
15 the city claiming the lien, the specific service that was provided, the amount of the unpaid  
16 charge for that service, and the date and place of furnishing that service. A lien on real property  
17 is not effective against an interest in real property conveyed after the fees become delinquent if  
18 the interest is recorded in the office of the register of deeds prior to the filing of the lien for  
19 delinquent water or sewer services. No lien under this act shall be valid unless filed in  
20 accordance with this section after 90 days of the date of the failure to pay for the service and  
21 within 180 days of the date of the failure to pay for the service. The lien may be discharged as  
22 provided in G.S. 44-48.

23 The city shall adopt an appeals process providing notice and an opportunity to be heard in  
24 protest of the imposition of such liens. The county tax office, once notified of the city's lien,  
25 shall include the lien amount on any tax bills printed subsequent to the notification. The county  
26 tax office shall add or remove liens from the tax bill at the request of the city (such as in the  
27 case of an appeal where the city decides to cancel the lien).

28 **SECTION 2.** This act applies to the City of Locust only.

29 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
