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SENATE BILL 636

Short Title: Grant Funds/Relocate Condemn Water Structure. (Public)

Sponsors: Senators Brown; and Preston.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
3 MAY AWARD GRANTS TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO RELOCATE
4 IMMEDIATELY THREATENED STRUCTURES OR DEMOLISH CONDEMNED
5 STRUCTURES LOCATED IN THE OCEAN OR INLET HAZARD AREAS.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 SECTION 1. G.S. 143-215.71 reads as rewritten:

8 "§ 143-215.71. Purposes for which grants may be requested.

9 Applications for grants may be made for the nonfederal share of water resources
10 development projects for the following purposes in amounts not to exceed the percentage of the
11 nonfederal costs indicated:

- 12 (1) General navigation projects that are sponsored by local governments –
13 eighty percent (80%);
14 (2) Recreational navigation projects – twenty-five percent (25%);
15 (3) Construction costs for water management (flood control and drainage)
16 purposes, including utility and road relocations not funded by the State
17 Department of Transportation – sixty-six and two-thirds percent (66 2/3%),
18 but only of that portion of the project specifically allocated for such flood
19 control or drainage purposes;
20 (4) Stream restoration – sixty-six and two-thirds percent (66 2/3%);
21 (5) Protection of privately owned beaches where public access is allowed and
22 provided for – seventy-five percent (75%);
23 (6) Land acquisition and facility development for water-based recreation sites
24 operated by local governments – fifty percent (50%);
25 (7) Aquatic weed control projects sponsored by local governments – fifty
26 percent (50%); ~~(50%);~~ or
27 (8) Relocation of imminently threatened structures or demolition of condemned
28 structures located in the ocean or inlet hazard areas as delineated by the NC
29 Division of Coastal Management – one hundred percent (100%)."

30 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
