A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE VARIOUS
SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-63(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Every license plate must display the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which it is issued, the name of the State of North Carolina, which may be abbreviated, and the year number for which it is issued or the date of expiration. A plate issued for a commercial vehicle, as defined in G.S. 20-4.2(1), and weighing 26,001 pounds or more, must bear the word "commercial," unless the plate is a special registration plate authorized in G.S. 20-79.4 or the commercial vehicle is a trailer or is licensed for 6,000 pounds or less. The plate issued for vehicles licensed for 7,000 pounds through 26,000 pounds must bear the word "weighted," unless the plate is a special registration plate authorized in G.S. 20-79.4.

~~Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a~~ A registration plate issued by the Division for a private passenger vehicle or for a private hauler vehicle licensed for 6,000 pounds or less shall be a "First in Flight" plate. A "First in Flight" plate shall have the words "First in Flight" printed at the top of the plate above all other letters and numerals. The background of the plate shall depict the Wright Brothers biplane flying over Kitty Hawk Beach, with the plane flying slightly upward and to the right. ~~The following special registration plates do not have to be a "First in Flight" plate. The design of the plates that are not "First in Flight" plates must be approved by the Division and the State Highway Patrol for clarity and ease of identification.~~

15 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 20-79.4 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

16 "(a3) The Division shall develop, in consultation with the State Highway Patrol and the
 17 Department of Correction, a standardized format for special license plates. The format shall
 18 allow for the license plate number to be easily read by the human eye and by cameras installed
 19 along roadways as part of tolling and speed enforcement. A designated segment of the plate
 20 shall be set aside for unique design representing various groups and interests. Nothing in this
 21 subsection shall be construed to require the recall of existing special license plates."

22 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 20-79.4(b) reads as rewritten:

23 "(b) Types. – The Division shall issue the following types of special registration plates:

25 () American Red Cross. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle in
 26 accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the phrase "American
 27 Red Cross Saving Lives" and a red cross.

 30 accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the phrase "Let's Move

 38 the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. The plate shall bear the phrase

 41 authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at least 300 applications for
 42 the plate.

 45 motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the
 46 phrase "Autism Society of North Carolina", ~~the phrase "Providing Support,~~
 47 ~~Promoting Opportunities"~~, and the logo of the Autism Society.

49 () Battle of Kings Mountain. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor
 50 vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the phrase

6 before this plate may be developed. A person may obtain a special
7 registration plate under this subdivision for a motor vehicle or motorcycle

45 vehicle. The plate shall bear the phrase "Childhood Cancer Hurts" beside the
46 logo of a gold ribbon on the left side of the plate. The Division may not issue
47 the plate authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at least 300
48 applications for the plate.

7 For a city clerk, the plate shall bear the words "City Clerk" followed by a
8 number representing the city clerk's city or town. The number of a city shall
9 be the order of the city in an alphabetical list of cities that assigns number
10 one to the first city in the list. For a county clerk, the plate shall bear the
11 words "County Clerk" followed by a number representing the county clerk's
12 county. The number of a county shall be the order of the county in an
13 alphabetical list of counties that assigns number one to the first county in the
14 list. The Division may not issue the plate authorized by this subdivision
15 unless it receives at least 300 applications for the plate.

17 (27) Civic Club. – Issuable to a member of a nationally recognized civic
18 organization whose member clubs in the State are exempt from State
19 corporate income tax under G.S. 105-130.11(a)(5). Examples of these clubs
20 include Jaycees, Kiwanis, Optimist, Rotary, Ruritan, and Shrine. The plate
21 shall bear a word or phrase identifying the civic club and the emblem of the
22 civic club. A person may obtain from the Division a special registration plate
23 under this subdivision for the registered owner of a motor vehicle or a
24 motorcycle. The registration fees and the restrictions on the issuance of a
25 specialized registration plate for a motorcycle are the same as for any motor
26 vehicle. The Division may not issue a civic club plate authorized by this
27 subdivision unless it receives at least 300 applications for that civic club
28 plate.

30 () Coastal Land Trust. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle in
31 accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the phrase "Coastal
32 Land Trust" with a logo designed by the North Carolina Coastal Land Trust.

34 () Concerned Bikers Association/ABATE of North Carolina. – Issuable to the
35 registered owner of a motor vehicle or a motorcycle in accordance with
36 G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the Concerned Bikers Association logo
37 with the phrase "Concerned Bikers Association." The Division must receive
38 300 or more applications for the plate before this plate may be developed. A
39 person may obtain a special registration plate under this subdivision for a
40 motor vehicle or motorcycle registered in that person's name. The
41 registration fees and the restrictions on the issuance of a specialized
42 registration plate for a motorcycle are the same as for any motor vehicle.
43 ...
44 (39) County Commissioner. – Issuable to a county commissioner of a county in
45 this State. The plate shall bear the words "County Commissioner" followed
46 first by a number representing the commissioner's county and then by a letter
47 or number that distinguishes plates issued to county commissioners of the
48 same county. The number of a county shall be the order of the county in an
49 alphabetical list of counties that assigns number one to the first county in the
50 list and a letter or number to distinguish different cars owned by the county
51 commissioners in that county. The Division may not issue the plate

- 1 authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at least ~~300~~100 applications
2 for the plate.

- 4 () Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden. – Issuable to the registered owner of a
5 motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the
6 phrase "Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden" with a logo designed by the Daniel
7 Stowe Botanical Garden Foundation, Inc.

- 9 () Donate Life. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle in
10 accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the phrase "Donate
11 Life" with a logo designed by Donate Life North Carolina.
- 12 ...
- 13 () Don't Tread on Me. – Issuable to a registered owner of a motor vehicle. The
14 plate shall bear the phrase "Don't Tread on Me" under the representation of
15 the Gadsden Flag. The Division may not issue the plate authorized by this
16 subdivision unless it receives at least 300 applications for the plate.

- 18 () Farmland Preservation. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle
19 in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear a phrase and picture
20 provided by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services

- 23 () First in Turf. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle in
24 accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the words "First in

26 (b123) Topsail Island Shoreline Protection. – The Division must receive 300 or more
27 applications for the "Topsail Island Shoreline Protection" plate before the plate may be
28 developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural
29 Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "Topsail Island Shoreline Protection" plates
30 proportionately to the Town of North Topsail Beach, the Town of Surf City, and the Town of
31 Topsail Beach to be used for support of the Topsail Island Shoreline Protection Committee and
32 beach nourishment programs or projects for the three towns on Topsail Island.

33 (b124) Travel and Tourism. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
34 "Travel and Tourism" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer
35 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
36 sale of "Travel and Tourism" plates to the Division of Tourism, Film, and Sports Development
37 to be used for programs in support of travel and tourism in North Carolina.

38 (b125) USO of NC. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for a USO of NC
39 plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must transfer quarterly the money in the
40 Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of USO of NC plates to
41 the United Services Organization of North Carolina to support the mission of the United
42 Services Organization in North Carolina to lead the way to enriching the lives of America's
43 military in North Carolina."

44 **SECTION 8.** Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
45 section to read:

46 **"§ 20-79.8. Expiration of special registration plate authorization.**

47 (a) Expiration. – A special registration plate authorized pursuant to G.S. 20-79.4 shall
48 expire, as a matter of law, on July 1 of the second calendar year following the year in which the
49 special plate was authorized if the number of required applications for the authorized special
50 plate has not been received by the Division. The Division shall not accept applications for nor
51 advertise any special registration plate that has expired pursuant to this section.

1 (b) Notification. – The Division shall notify the Revisor of Statutes in writing, not later
2 than July 15 of each year, which special registration plate authorizations have expired as a
3 matter of law pursuant to subsection (a) of this section. The Division shall publish a copy of the
4 written notification sent to the Revisor of Statutes pursuant to this subsection on a Web site
5 maintained by the Division or the Department of Transportation.

6 (c) Revisor of Statutes Responsibilities. – Upon notification of expiration of the
7 authorization for any special registration plate by the Division pursuant to this section, the
8 Revisor of Statutes shall verify that the authorization for each special registration plate listed
9 has expired and shall notate such expiration in the applicable statutes. If an authorization for a
10 special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of Statutes shall revise the
11 subdivision referring to the special registration plate to leave the name of the special
12 registration plate authorized and the date the special registration plate's authorization expired. If
13 an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of
14 Statutes shall also make corresponding changes to reflect the expiration of the special
15 registration plate's authorization, if applicable, in G.S. 20-63(b), 20-79.7, and 20-81.12."

16 **SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding Section 8 of this act, any special registration plate
17 authorized in G.S. 20-79.7, prior to July 1, 2011, shall expire, as a matter of law, on July 1,
18 2013, if the number of applications required for the production of the special registration plate
19 has not been received by the Division of Motor Vehicles on or before that date. Upon
20 notification of expiration of the authorization for any special plate by the Division pursuant to
21 this section, the Revisor of Statutes shall verify that the authorization for each special
22 registration plate listed has expired and shall notate such expiration in the applicable statutes. If
23 an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of
24 Statutes shall revise the subdivision referring to the special registration plate to leave the name
25 of the special plate authorized and the date the special registration plate's authorization expired.
26 If an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of
27 Statutes shall also make corresponding changes to reflect the expiration of the special
28 registration plate's authorization, if applicable, in G.S. 20-63(b), 20-79.7, and 20-81.12.

29 **SECTION 10.** The Revisor of Statutes is authorized to alphabetize, number, and
30 renumber the special registration plates listed in G.S. 20-79.4 to ensure that all the special
31 registration plates are listed in alphabetical order and numbered accordingly.

32 **SECTION 11.** Section 8 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2011. The remainder
33 of this act is effective when it becomes law. The changes made by Section 1 of this act shall not
34 be construed to require the recall of an existing full-color special license plate issued to a
35 registered owner of a motor vehicle, but no additional or replacement full-color special license
36 plates may be issued on or after the effective date of this act.
