The Commission for Public Health shall determine specific services to be provided under each of the essential public health services categories listed above."

SECTION 3. The Department of Health and Human Services shall allocate, from funds appropriated, the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to the Division of Public Health to provide incentives to local health departments through the Public Health Improvement Incentive Program.

SECTION 4. The Program Evaluation Division of the General Assembly shall study the feasibility of the transfer of all functions, powers, duties, and obligations vested in the

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- Division of Public Health in the Department of Health and Human Services to the University of
- 2 North Carolina Healthcare System and submit its findings and recommendations to the Joint
- 3 Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative Oversight
- 4 Committee on Health and Human Services no later than February 1, 2012.
- **SECTION 5.** Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2011. The remainder
- 6 of this act is effective when it becomes law.
