1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO MAKE A TECHNICAL CORRECTION TO THE INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES  
3 SALES TAX REFUND AND A TECHNICAL CORRECTION TO THE MEMBERSHIP  
4 COUNT OF THE UWHARRIE COMMISSION.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 105-164.14B(a) reads as rewritten:

7 "(a) Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:

8 ...

9 (12) Owner. – The term includes a lessee under a lease-purchase contract.

10 (13) Paper-from-pulp manufacturing. – An industry primarily engaged in  
11 manufacturing or converting paper, other than newsprint or uncoated  
12 groundwood paper, from pulp or pulp products, or in converting purchased  
13 sanitary paper stock or wadding into sanitary paper products.

14 ...

15 (21) Reserved.

16 (22) Turbine manufacturing. – An industry primarily engaged in manufacturing  
17 turbines or complete turbine generator set units, such as steam, hydraulic,  
18 gas, and wind. The term does not include the manufacturing of aircraft  
19 turbines."

20 **SECTION 1.(b)** G.S. 105-164.14B(b)(1) reads as rewritten:

21 "(1) Business requirement. – The facility is primarily engaged in one or more of  
22 the following:

23 a. Air courier services.

24 b. Aircraft manufacturing.

25 c. Bioprocessing.

26 d. Financial services, securities operations, and related systems  
27 development.

28 e. Motor vehicle manufacturing.

29 f. Paper-from-pulp manufacturing.

30 g. Pharmaceutical and medicine manufacturing and distribution of  
31 pharmaceuticals and medicines.

32 ~~g-h.~~ Semiconductor manufacturing.

33 ~~h-i.~~ Solar electricity generating materials manufacturing.

34 ~~j.~~ Turbine manufacturing."

35 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 153C-3(d) reads as rewritten:

36 "(d) Membership. – The Commission shall consist of ~~10~~12 members as follows:



- 1 (1) One representative from the public at large who is a resident of the Uwharrie  
2 region of North Carolina appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
3 Senate.
- 4 (2) One representative from the public at large who is a resident of the Uwharrie  
5 region of North Carolina appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
6 Representatives.
- 7 (3) Four representatives from the public at large who are residents of the  
8 Uwharrie region of North Carolina to be appointed by the Governor,  
9 including:
- 10 a. Two who shall at the time of appointment be actively connected with  
11 or have experience in local government within the Uwharrie region  
12 of North Carolina.
- 13 b. One who shall at the time of appointment have experience in tourism  
14 or tourism development in the Uwharrie region of North Carolina.
- 15 c. One who shall have experience in economic development in the  
16 Uwharrie region of North Carolina.
- 17 (4) Two members to represent each of the following regional councils of  
18 government as appointed by those councils: the Centralina Council of  
19 Governments and the Piedmont Triad Council of Governments.
- 20 (5) The Secretary of Commerce or the Secretary's designee.
- 21 (6) The Secretary of Environment and Natural Resources or the Secretary's  
22 designee.

23 The members of the Commission shall elect a chair, vice-chair, and any other officers they  
24 consider necessary and shall determine the length of the term of office, not to exceed two years,  
25 of each officer. A majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum. Each member  
26 appointed to the Commission shall be appointed to serve a four-year term. Any vacancy on the  
27 Commission shall be filled by the original appointing authority for the remainder of the  
28 unexpired term. Initial terms commence September 1, 2010."

29 **SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2010, and applies to  
30 sales made on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
