Short Title: Retroactive Sex Offender Registration.

2 AN ACT TO MAKE MANDATORY SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION APPLY TO
3 OFFENDERS NOT COVERED BY OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 SECTION 1. G.S. 14-208.7 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 14-208.7. Registration.

7 ...

8 (a3) Any person who has ever been convicted of a reportable conviction and has not
9 been required to register for that conviction under any other provision of law shall be required
10 to register for that conviction pursuant to this Article if any of the following apply:

- 11 (1) On October 1, 2017, the person is required to register for another offense
12 pursuant to this Article.
13 (2) On October 1, 2017, the person is serving an active term of imprisonment
14 for any criminal offense.
15 (3) On October 1, 2017, the person is on probation, parole, or post-release
16 supervision for any criminal offense.
17 (4) On or after October 1, 2017, the person is convicted of any criminal offense.

18 A person required to register pursuant to subdivision (1) or (3) of this subsection shall
19 register for the prior reportable conviction on or before October 6, 2017. A person required to
20 register pursuant to subdivision (2) or (4) of this subsection shall register as provided in
21 subsection (a) of this section.

22 Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, if (i) the conviction of a reportable
23 conviction prior to October 1, 2017, was not for an aggravated offense as defined in
24 G.S. 14-208.6(1a), (ii) the conviction occurred 30 years or more prior to the date the person is
25 required to register pursuant to this subsection, and (iii) the person has no other reportable
26 convictions requiring registration under this Article, the person shall not be required to register
27 pursuant to this subsection.
