A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT PROVIDING CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS

AN ACT PROVIDING CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS TO TRIANGLE RESIDENTIAL OPTIONS FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSERS, INC.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1.(a) The State Controller shall transfer the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year from the Coronavirus Relief Reserve established by Section 2.1 of S.L. 2020-4 to the Coronavirus Relief Fund established by Section 2.2 of that act.

SECTION 1.(b) There is appropriated from the Coronavirus Relief Fund established by Section 2.2 of S.L. 2020-4 to the Office of State Budget and Management the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in nonrecurring funds, to be allocated to Triangle Residential Options for Substance Abusers, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, for the purposes of (i) offsetting increased operational expenses incurred for providing comprehensive residential substance use disorder treatment associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, for the period beginning March 1, 2020, and ending December 30, 2020, and (ii) any other COVID-19 related losses or expenses incurred during that time period, as allowed under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, P.L. 116-136. These funds shall not be used for any purpose disallowed by the CARES Act.

SECTION 1.(c) The funds appropriated in this section shall not revert at the end of the 2019-2020 fiscal year but shall remain available to expend until December 30, 2020.

SECTION 2. By March 1, 2021, TROSA shall provide a report to the House Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Senate Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services detailing the use of funds appropriated under this act.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
