1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION TO EXTEND A HOUSE RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2019  
2 HOUSE PERMANENT RULES OF THE 2019 GENERAL ASSEMBLY DURING  
3 EMERGENCIES.

4 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

5 **SECTION 1.** House Resolution 1044, adopted April 28, 2020, expired May 31,  
6 2020. House Resolution 1044 is hereby readopted in full by the House of Representatives as it  
7 existed at the time it expired and reads as rewritten:

8 "**SECTION 1.** As a result of the public health dangers resulting from the COVID-19  
9 pandemic, the following shall apply to the 2019 House Permanent Rules:

10 (1) RULE 1 shall read as follows: "RULE 1. **Convening Hour.** – The House shall  
11 convene each legislative day at the hour fixed by the House. In the event the  
12 House adjourns on the preceding legislative day without having fixed an hour  
13 for reconvening, the House shall convene on the next legislative day at 10:00  
14 A.M."

15 (2) RULE 2 shall read as follows: "RULE 2. **Opening the Session.** – The  
16 Sergeant-at-Arms or the Principal Clerk shall clear the House 10 minutes  
17 before the convening hour. At the convening hour on each legislative day, the  
18 Speaker or the Speaker's designee shall call the members to order."

19 (3) RULE 3(b) shall read as follows: "(b) Should the point of a quorum be  
20 raised, the Clerk shall open an electronic roll call of the House and enter as  
21 present a member responding by vote. The time allowed for the response shall  
22 be the greater of ~~40~~30 minutes, unless without objection, the Chair directs  
23 otherwise, and the time at which the sixty-first vote is recorded. In the absence  
24 of a quorum comprised of members responding to the call, the House may  
25 only stand in recess or adjourn."

26 (3a) RULE 4(b) shall read as follows: "(b) Immediately following the call to  
27 order the Speaker shall call for the Journal report by the Chair of the Standing  
28 Committee on Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House, or by a  
29 Representative designated by the Chair, as to whether the proceedings of the  
30 previous day have been correctly recorded. Without objection, the Speaker  
31 shall cause the Journal to stand approved."

32 (4) RULE 7(a) shall read as follows: "RULE 7. **Obtaining Floor.** – (a) No  
33 member on the floor shall proceed until recognized by the Speaker for a  
34 purpose. When any member on the floor desires recognition for any purpose,  
35 the member shall rise and respectfully address the Speaker. When any member  
36 who has designated a Leader to cast the member's vote desires to propound a



1 question, the member shall submit the question to the Majority or Minority  
2 Leader to have the question brought forward, and the Leader or the Leader's  
3 designee, shall rise, shall respectfully address the Speaker, and upon being  
4 recognized, shall identify the member desiring to propound the question and  
5 state the question propounded."

6 (5) RULE 8.1 shall read as follows: "RULE 8.1. **Points of Personal Privilege;**  
7 **Representative Statements; Explanation of Vote.** – Upon recognition by  
8 the Speaker for that purpose, any member may speak to a point of personal  
9 privilege for a time not exceeding three minutes. The Speaker shall determine  
10 if the question raised is one of personal privilege and shall, without the point  
11 of order being raised, enforce this rule. A member may reserve some or all of  
12 that time to explain to the House a "Representative Statement"; provided,  
13 however, that the reading of the Representative Statement shall only occur  
14 following session. Upon motion supported by a majority present and voting,  
15 that statement may be spread upon the Journal. Neither personal privilege nor  
16 a Representative Statement may be used to explain a vote, debate a bill, or in  
17 any way disrupt the regular business of the House, nor shall such opportunities  
18 be used to solicit support or sponsors for any bill. The format of a  
19 Representative Statement shall be prescribed by the Chair of the Standing  
20 Committee on Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House, but in any case  
21 shall speak only in the voice of the member submitting it."

22 (6) RULE 12(i) shall read as follows: "(i) The use of a mobile device or  
23 cellular phone for the purpose of making or receiving a phone call shall not  
24 be permitted in the House Chamber while the House is in session. During a  
25 vote the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader may use electronic  
26 technology, including a mobile device or cellular phone, to communicate in  
27 real time with members who have filed a voting designation pursuant to Rule  
28 22.1, provided such use does not otherwise disrupt the decorum of the  
29 chamber."

30 (7) RULE 12 shall be amended to have the following additional subdivision: "(k)  
31 As deemed necessary by the Chair of the Standing Committee on Rules,  
32 Calendar, and Operations of the House, the chamber may be used by  
33 committees for committee purposes."

34 (8) RULE 13(a) shall read as follows: "RULE 13. **Motions Generally.** – (a) A  
35 motion that is complex, complicated, or otherwise not easily understood shall  
36 be reduced to writing at the request of the Speaker or any member. No motion  
37 relating to a bill shall be in order that does not identify the bill by its number  
38 and short title. No motion may be made, nor business presented, by a member  
39 who has filed a voting designation pursuant to Rule 22.1 affirming the member  
40 will not be present in the House during the time the designation is in effect  
41 and has not been revoked."

42 (9) RULE 15(a) shall read as follows: "RULE 15. **Motion to Adjourn.** – (a) A  
43 motion to adjourn shall be put to the vote of the House without being  
44 seconded."

45 (10) RULE 15.1 shall read as follows: "RULE 15.1. **Motion to Adjourn or Stand**  
46 **in Recess; Standard Stipulations.** – A motion to adjourn or stand in recess  
47 subject to the standard stipulations shall constitute a motion to adjourn or  
48 stand in recess subject to the ratification of bills, messages from the Senate,  
49 committee reports, conference reports, referral and re-referral of bills and  
50 resolutions, appointment of conferees, introduction of bills and resolutions,

- 1 committee appointments, the reading of Representative Statements, and the  
2 receiving of petitions, memorials, or papers addressed to the ~~House~~.House."
- 3 (11) RULE 20(c) shall read as follows: "(c) When the electronic voting system  
4 is used, ~~40-30~~ minutes shall be allowed for voting on the question before the  
5 House unless, without objection, the Chair shall direct otherwise. The Chair  
6 may direct a procedure whereby members vote at designated times within the  
7 time allowed for voting. Once the system is locked, the vote shall be recorded  
8 and printed."
- 9 (12) The Rules are amended by adding a new rule to read: "RULE 22.1.  
10 **Designated Voting.** – A member who is not present may designate either the  
11 Majority or the Minority Leader to cast the member's vote if all the following  
12 requirements are met:
- 13 (a) The member has filed a voting designation stating the member will not  
14 be present in the House and identifying either the Majority or Minority  
15 Leader as the member's voting designee. If the designated Leader has  
16 an excused absence from the House, the designated Leader may  
17 appoint another member to cast all votes designated to that Leader.  
18 Any designation or appointment under this subdivision shall be on a  
19 form made available from and filed with the Principal Clerk, shall  
20 include a commencement and expiration date, and may be revoked in  
21 writing, electronic or otherwise, at any time.
- 22 (b) At least 61 members have voted in the House Chamber when the  
23 question is put, after which the Speaker shall call upon the Majority  
24 and Minority Leaders to cast the votes of members who have made a  
25 designation pursuant to this Rule.
- 26 (c) At least three hours have elapsed from the time the bill to be voted on  
27 was placed on the calendar."
- 28 (13) RULE 22(b) shall read as follows: "(b) Except as provided in Rule 22.1, no  
29 member may vote unless the member is in the Chamber when the question is  
30 put. This subsection of this rule cannot be suspended."
- 31 (14) RULE 26(f) shall read as follows: "(f) The chair or acting chair, designated  
32 by the chair or by the Speaker, and five other members of the standing  
33 committee or permanent subcommittee, or a majority of the standing  
34 committee or permanent subcommittee, whichever is fewer, shall constitute a  
35 quorum of that standing committee or permanent subcommittee. A quorum of  
36 less than a majority of all the members must include at least one member of  
37 the minority party. For purposes of determining a quorum, the Chair of the  
38 Standing Committee on Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House; the  
39 Speaker Pro Tempore; the Majority Leader; and the Deputy Majority Leader,  
40 when serving only as ex officio members under subsection (e) of this rule,  
41 shall be counted among the membership of the committee or subcommittee  
42 only when present or participating remotely pursuant to Rule 28(a). A  
43 committee member who is participating remotely under Rule 28(a) shall be  
44 counted as present for quorum purposes."
- 45 (15) RULE 28(a) shall read as follows: "RULE 28. **Standing Committee and**  
46 **Permanent Subcommittee Meetings.** – (a) Standing committees and  
47 permanent subcommittees of standing committees shall be furnished with  
48 suitable meeting places pursuant to a schedule established by the Chair of the  
49 Standing Committee on Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House. Select  
50 committees shall be furnished with suitable meeting places as their needs  
51 require by the Chair of the Standing Committee on Rules, Calendar, and

1 Operations of the House. Committees may conduct meetings with members  
2 participating remotely provided all the following requirements are met:

3 (a) Each member is able to communicate, in real time, with all other  
4 members by (i) in-person communication, (ii) remote communication  
5 using devices or programs that transmit audio or audio and video, or  
6 (iii) both.

7 (b) All documents considered by the committee are provided to members.

8 (c) The committee otherwise complies with G.S. 143-318.13(a)."

9 (16) RULE 30 shall read as follows: "RULE 30. **Committee of the Whole House.**  
10 – A Committee of the Whole House shall not be formed."

11 (17) RULE 31(a) shall read as follows: "RULE 31. **Introduction of Bills and**  
12 **Resolutions.** – (a) All bills and resolutions shall be introduced only by  
13 submitting the same to the Principal Clerk's office using the member's  
14 electronic dashboard. The bill or resolution must be submitted by 3:00 P.M.,  
15 or 30 minutes after adjournment of a session later than 3:00 P.M., in order to  
16 be read a first time on that legislative day."

17 (18) Notwithstanding RULES 32 and 41, a resolution or bill may be placed on the  
18 calendar without being referred by the Speaker to a committee and on the same  
19 legislative day of its introduction or receipt from the Senate; provided,  
20 however, no vote may be taken on such bill until at least three hours have  
21 elapsed from the time it is placed on the calendar and the time the question is  
22 put.

23 (19) RULE 32(e) is repealed.

24 (20) RULE 34(b) shall read as follows: "(b) A bill may be filed for introduction  
25 without the signature of each member whose name appears on the preprinted  
26 bill jacket as a primary sponsor if each such member has approved being  
27 included as a primary sponsor using the member's electronic dashboard."

28 (21) Notwithstanding RULE 36(b), a bill reported favorably by a committee or  
29 received for concurrence may be placed on the favorable calendar on the same  
30 day it is reported. The Speaker shall provide notice as soon as practicable to  
31 the Majority and the Minority Leader if the Speaker anticipates a bill will be  
32 placed on the favorable calendar the same day it is reported.

33 (22) Notwithstanding RULE 36.1A, a proposed committee substitute does not have  
34 to be distributed electronically to committee members on the preceding  
35 calendar day in order to be considered by the committee.

36 (23) RULE 39(a) shall read as follows: "RULE 39. **Discharge Petition.** – (a) A  
37 motion to discharge a committee from consideration of a bill may be filed with  
38 the Principal Clerk by a primary sponsor of that measure if accompanied by a  
39 petition asking that the committee be discharged from further consideration of  
40 the bill. No motion may be filed until 10 legislative days after the bill has been  
41 referred to the committee. No petition may be filed until notice has been given  
42 on the floor of the House that the petition is to be filed and the primary sponsor  
43 giving notice has obtained a fiscal note from the Fiscal Research Division on  
44 the bill, which note shall be attached to the petition. Members may submit the  
45 petition or submit their name to be added to a petition by submitting an  
46 electronic mail indicating such submission with the office of the Principal  
47 Clerk, and when the signatures of 61 members appear on the petition, the  
48 Principal Clerk shall place that motion on the calendar for the next legislative  
49 day as a special order of business. Members may withdraw their names at any  
50 time until 61 names appear. If the motion is adopted by the House, then the  
51 committee to which the bill or resolution has been referred is discharged from

1 further consideration of the bill, and that bill is placed on the calendar for the  
2 next legislative day as a special order of business. The Principal Clerk shall  
3 provide a form for discharge petitions."

4 (24) Notwithstanding RULE 41:

5 (a) The first reading and reference to a standing committee of a House bill  
6 shall occur on the legislative day of its introduction. The first reading  
7 and reference to a standing committee of a Senate bill shall occur on  
8 the legislative day of its receipt on messages from the Senate. The  
9 Speaker shall give notice at each subsequent reading whether it is the  
10 second or third reading.

11 (b) Except for a bill governed by Section 23 of Article II of the North  
12 Carolina Constitution, a bill may be read more than once on the same  
13 day.

14 (25) Notwithstanding RULE 44(d), a conference report may be placed on the  
15 calendar for the legislative day on which the report is received. The Speaker  
16 shall provide notice as soon as practicable to the Majority and the Minority  
17 Leader if the Speaker anticipates a conference report will be placed on the  
18 favorable calendar the same day the report is received.

19 (26) ~~RULE 52 shall read as follows: "RULE 52. Gallery. — In order to minimize~~  
20 ~~public health dangers resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, the galleries~~  
21 ~~shall be closed to the public. Members may be seated in designated areas of~~  
22 ~~the gallery instead of on the chamber floor in order to maintain social~~  
23 ~~distancing. Pursuant to Rule 51, other designated areas of the gallery shall be~~  
24 ~~used as an assigned place for admittance of reporters pursuant to Rule 51."~~

25 (27) ~~Notwithstanding RULE 59, any member wishing to cosponsor a bill or~~  
26 ~~resolution that has been introduced may do so on the day during which the bill~~  
27 ~~or resolution was first read and referred, but only while the bill or resolution~~  
28 ~~is in the possession of the House.~~

29 (28) The Rules are amended by adding a new rule to read: "RULE 61.3. **Process**  
30 **to Terminate.** – ~~If either the Majority Leader or the Speaker, the Majority~~  
31 ~~Leader, or the Minority Leader submits a written objection to the continued~~  
32 ~~use of the modifications of the 2019 House Permanent Rules contained in this~~  
33 ~~Resolution, the modification shall expire at midnight on the day the objection~~  
34 ~~is submitted. The written objection may be electronic. An objection must~~  
35 ~~comply with all of the following in order to be effective:~~

36 (a) It must be received by the Principal Clerk on ~~either May 4, 2020, May~~  
37 ~~11, 2020, or May 18, 2020~~ any Monday by 5:00 P.M.

38 (b) ~~A~~ If the objection is submitted by either the Majority Leader or the  
39 Minority leader, a copy of the objection must be provided to the  
40 Speaker on the same day the objection is submitted to the Principal  
41 Clerk.

42 (c) If the House is in session on the day the objection is filed, the Principal  
43 Clerk shall read the objection into the record that day. If the objection  
44 is filed on a day when the House is not in session, the Principal Clerk  
45 shall read it into the record on the next legislative day following the  
46 submission of the ~~objection~~ objection."

47 "SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption and expires on the earlier of an  
48 objection submitted pursuant to Rule 61.3 of this resolution or May 31, 2020 adjournment sine  
49 die of the 2019 General Assembly."

50 SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption.
